Composition: Diclofenac sodium

1.00mg/ml.

Indications: Postoperative inflammation after cataract surgery and other surgical procedures. Preoperative and postoperative prevention of cystoid macular oedema associated with lens extraction and intraocular lens implantation. Non-infectious inflammatory conditions affecting the anterior region of the eye (e.g. chronic non-infectious conjunctivitis). Posttraumatic inflammation in penetrating wounds (as an adjuvant to local antiinfective therapy).

Dosage and administration

Preoperative: up to 5x1 drop over the 3 hours preceding surgery. Postoperative: 3x1 drop immediately after surgery, thereafter 3-5x1 drop daily for as long as required.

Other indications: 4-5x1 drop daily, depending on the severity of the condition. Or as directed by the physician.

Contraindications: Like other nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory agents, Diclofenac is contraindicated in patients in whom attacks of asthma, urticaria, or acute rhinitis have been observed following application of acetyl salicylic acid or other cyclo-oxygenase inhibitors.

Sterile Eye Drops

Precautions: Patients tending toward uncontrolled bleeding or under therapy with anticoagulants should Diclofenac with caution. If infection is present or there is a risk of infection, appropriate treatment (e.g. with antibiotics) should be given concomitantly.

Side effects: Occasional mild or moderate, transient stinging and/or blurred vision directly after application of eye drops. Hypersensitivity reaction in the form of itching, reddening, and photosensitivity; post-operative mydriasis have been reported rare.

Pregnancy and lactation : Pregnancy Category **C** by FDA.

Packing: 5ml in plastic dropper bottle.
