Composition: Prednisolone Acetate 10mg/ml.

Indication: For steroid responsive inflammation of the palpebral and bulbar conjunctiva, cornea and anterior segment of the globe.

Dosage and administration: 1 to 2 drops instilled into the conjunctival sac two to four times daily. During the initial 24 to 48 hours the doses may be safely increased to 2 drops every hour. Care should be taken not to discontinue therapy prematurely or as directed by the registered physician.

Contraindications: Acute untreated purulent ocular infections, acute superficial herpes simplex (dendritic keratitis), vaccinia, varicella and most other viral diseases of the cornea and conjunctiva, ocular tuberculosis and fungal diseases of the eye, and sensitivity to any components of the formulation.

Side effects: Increased intraocular pressure, with optic nerve damage, defects in the visual fields. Also posterior subcapsular cataract formation, secondary ocular infections from fungi or viruses. Perforation of the globe when used in conditions where there is thinning of the cornea or sclera, and delayed wound healing. Systemic side effects may occur with extensive use of steroids.
